The Caucus is a non-profit, non-partisan community-based group that meets every two years to nominate, interview, and endorse candidates to the Districts 64 and 207 School Boards in upcoming elections. Caucus delegates represent approximately 40 civic organizations within the school district boundaries, including churches, school PTOs, community clubs, charitable organizations, and sport or child activity organizations of many types.

The Caucus looks for individuals with a commitment to providing quality education for the whole child, familiarity with issues facing local schools, and a policy of fiscal responsibility.

In order to win Caucus endorsement, candidates first undergo a rigorous and lengthy interviewing process. In addition to completing an extensive application, they appear several times before Caucus delegates to make policy presentations, answer questions, and participate in a panel discussion with all nominees.
