Dear friends and neighbors,

Local elections are coming up on April 9. I still have two years left on my term on the District 64 school board, so I am not on the ballot this year, but we have a very competitive race for the four board positions that are up for election this year. I am writing to encourage you to vote this year to help us keep our great schools strong and make them better.

Six candidates are running for four positions this year. While I do not know all of them personally, I heartily recommend two candidates, whom I have come to know well through my board service.

- Scott Zimmerman, our current board vice-president, is running for his second term on the board. Scott is chief
  information officer with CenterPoint Properties, and he brings strong experience in technology, facilities, and
  human resources to our board. Scott has shown a great temperament and good judgment on the board, and
  he is the only incumbent running for re-election this year. I have attached Scott's flyer describing his
  background further.
- Terry Cameron is executive vice president with Emdeon, a healthcare information services company, and he is running for his first term on the board. Terry has a keen interest in helping our board grow stronger, and he has prepared for board service by talking with stakeholders throughout our District, including parents, teachers, and nearly all of our principals and other administrators.
